# AIMS OF PUNISHMENT

I: Teacher led

## PROTECTION

Keeping the public from being harmed, threatened or injured by criminals

## RETRIBUTION

To get your own back 'an eye for an eye' e.g. Death penalty for serious crimes

## DETERRENCE

To put people off committing crimes e.g. Prison, fines etc

## REFORMATION

To change someone's behaviour for the better e.g. therapy

## VINDICATION

Offenders must be punished to show that the law must be respected and is right

## REPARATION

Designed to help an offender put something back into society e.g. Community service

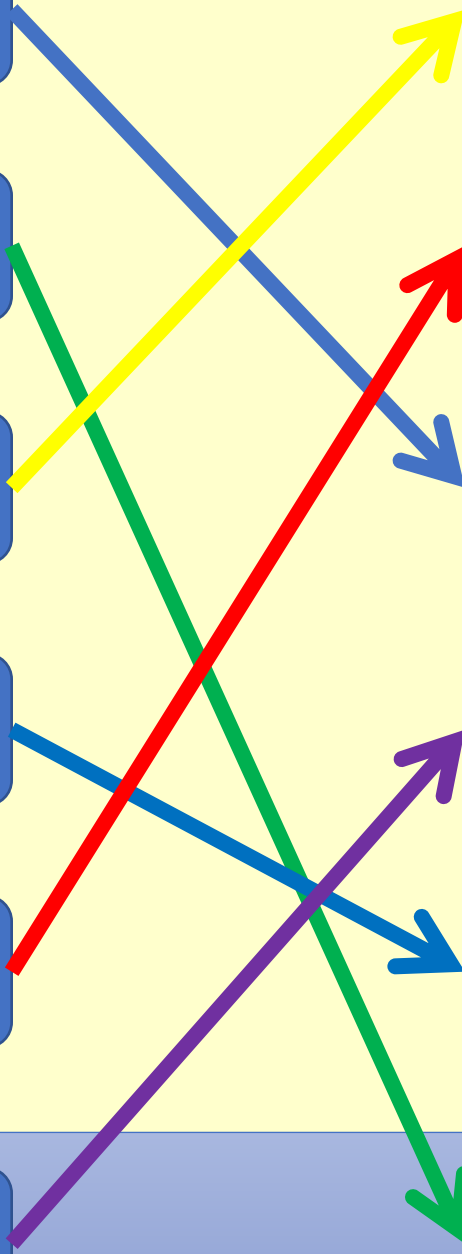
